

SUBJECT: ACCESS FOR ELLS - TEAM OF ASSESSORS AND CERTIFICATION

ACTION: The testing window for ACCESS for ELLs is January 25, 2021 – March 19, 2021. All schools are required to have a team of test administrators for the administration of ACCESS for ELLs.

District training will be pre-recorded and stored on the ESOL CANVAS course for Test Coordinators to view as many times as needed. Training will be available by December 18, 2020.

All test administrators must take the training module quizzes and receive a passing score of 80% in order to administer the assessments. Log in to the WIDA Secure Portal to access training courses and quizzes. Test administrators must hold a valid WIDA Certificate dated July 2019 or after n order to administer ACCESS for ELLs suite of assessments.

RATIONALE: Students identified as active ELLs (LY), as of January 25, 2021, must be assessed on all four domains of ACCESS for ELLs. Florida administers the paper-based version of ACCESS for ELLs to assess student growth and mastery of the WIDA standards and to meet the requirements of Tife III. A and ESSA. Alternate ACCESS for ELLs is for ELLs with severe cognitive disorders who typically take the Florida Standards Alternate Assessment (FSAA). For information on WIDA visit https://wida.wiso.edu/.

If the school is unable to test virtual students on ACCESS for ELLs, then we need to document any attempts made to contact the parent and any responses received from the parents in the student's ELL Plan. Students who do not take the test will not receive a score.



ACCESS for ELLs Communication Log

As of January 25, 2021, schools must begin administering all four domains of ACCESS for ELLs to LY students who are attending school in person as well as students who are working remotely. Schools must attempt to schedule all students who are working remotely for in person assessment.

- If the school is unable to assess students working remotely on ACCESS for ELLs, then the school must document all attempts to contact parents (e.g. in writing, e-mail or phone)
- All communication attempts must be documented at the end of the testing window on ELLevation
- Any student who is not assessed will not receive an updated composite score/Language Classification for the 2021/2022 school year

- Federal requirements for English Language Proficiency testing remain in place.
- When testing groups of students, test in a room large enough that students can be seated at a distance.
- Be sure all students can hear the test administrator and any recorded audio that will be played during testing.
- Use a projector to display test booklet pages or other materials that don't need to be touched.
- Provide clear face shields.

Keep in mind that some materials, like the activity board and cards used for kindergarten tests, can be wiped down without any modification.

Only some test materials can be modified! Do not modify any test material in which students mark answers and that must be returned for scoring.

ACTION: As of January 25, 2021, schools must begin administering all four domains of the ACCESS for ELLs to LY students who are attending school in person. Schools must also attempt to assess all students who are working remotely. If the school is unable to assess students working remotely on ACCESS for ELLs, then the school must document all attempts to contact parents and parent responses. Students who do not take the test will not receive a score.

Complete the Testing Coordinator Contacts Form located on the Student Assessment and Research Department SharePoint site (under the Testing menu) or at the following link: https://bcps.browardschools.com/research/sar/forms/tc/tcl_oqin.asp. Indicate at least one person at your school as the "ELL ACCESS" contact.

By January 15, 2021, all schools are required to have a team of assessors who must complete the state-required online ACCESS for ELLs Training Course. Refer to the memo posted on PIVOT ACCESS for ELLs - Team of Assessors and Certification for information on creating accounts and certification requirements.

Executive Order #7

Extended deadline for use of ACCESS scores for REEVALS

All REEVALs for extension of services <u>due after October 31st</u> must be completed whether the student is attending remotely or in person.

No IPT L/S/R/W required!

- Convene an ELL Committee Meeting
- Use Spring 2020 ACCESS scores AND district Reading progress monitoring data (e.g. iReady, Imagine Learning, BAS, etc.) to make determination to continue or exit.
- Basis of exit "L"









LF Process in ELLevation








LF Process in ELLevation





SUBJECT: INTERNAL TRANSFER MORATORIUM LIFTED

ACTION: All students are eligible to resume transfers between district schools when their primary residential address changes beginning on Thursday, October 8, 2020.

RATIONALE: Previously, a September 8, 2020 memo created a moratorium on Internal transfers until school campuses physically reopen. This moratorium is now lifted as students may begin returning to brick-and-mortar schools on Friday, October 9, 2020.

Students whose primary residential address has changed and choose to:

- Remain in the eLearning environment may continue enrollment in their current school or transfer to their new school.
- Attend in-person at the current brick-and-mortar school must complete a reassignment application to remain at that school. Eligibility to remain through the end of the current school year or through the highest grade level offered at the school will be determined based on the
