Q: How can I combine multiple Developmental Language Arts ESOL-Reading 6-12 (DLA) classes/sections on Canvas?

A: Courses are imported into Canvas from TERMS. However, you may create separate course/section(s) and invite all of your students to join. Contact your school administrator for their expectations.

Q: Should I include content and language objectives in my digital learning classes?

A: Yes. You should have language and content objectives for lessons taught remotely.

Q: Where can I find resources for Keystone?

A: You can find resources for Keystone under the “Keystone PELS” tab in the Developmental Language Arts ESOL Reading 6-12 Canvas course. You can import these materials into your own Canvas courses.

Q: Is there a way to play the audio (for Keystone) to match the textbook at the same time?

A: Students can sync the audio with the textbook on their own.

Q: How do I log into *Scholastic Action* online?

A: Teachers can log into *Scholastic Action* by visiting: <https://action.scholastic.com/>. Visit the “*Scholastic Action*” tab in the DLA Canvas course for step-by-step instructions on how to log into *Scholastic Action*. You may also refer to these step-by-step instructions to reset your class password if needed. Students will need this class password to log in online.

Q: How can students complete the PDF worksheets that go along with the *Scholastic Action* magazine?

A: Students can convert PDF documents into writable files by using a program like [PDFcandy.com](https://pdfcandy.com). Teachers can also have students take pictures of completed work and upload to their assignment.

Q: Can I add *Scholastic Action* worksheets to Canvas?

A: *Scholastic Action* worksheets can be imported into Canvas courses. Review the “Getting Started with Canvas” app on your Clever Launchpad for more information.

Q: Can students complete assignments on Canvas for *Scholastic Action*?

A: The entire magazine and related activities from *Scholastic Action* can be imported into Canvas courses. See the “Getting Started with Canvas” app on the Clever Launchpad with more information to create assignments.

Q: How do I get access to the Digital DLA Developmental Language Arts ESOL-Reading Canvas course?

A: The Digital DLA Developmental Language Arts ESOL-Reading Canvas course can be accessed by visiting: <https://browardschools.instructure.com/enroll/FL66MP> and enrolling in the course.

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Q: What strategies should I use to make digital content comprehensible to my ELLs, especially my newcomers?

A: Use strategies comparable to those that you would use in the classroom—referring to the WIDA CAN DO Descriptors and digital resources to scaffold according to students' English language proficiency levels and home language literacy skills.

Q: Can paraprofessionals be added to the Canvas courses?

A: Contact the Innovative Learning Department for information regarding adding paraprofessionals to a course.

A: InSync provides online and printable activities to support academic achievement in math, reading, writing, science, and test taking in English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole.
