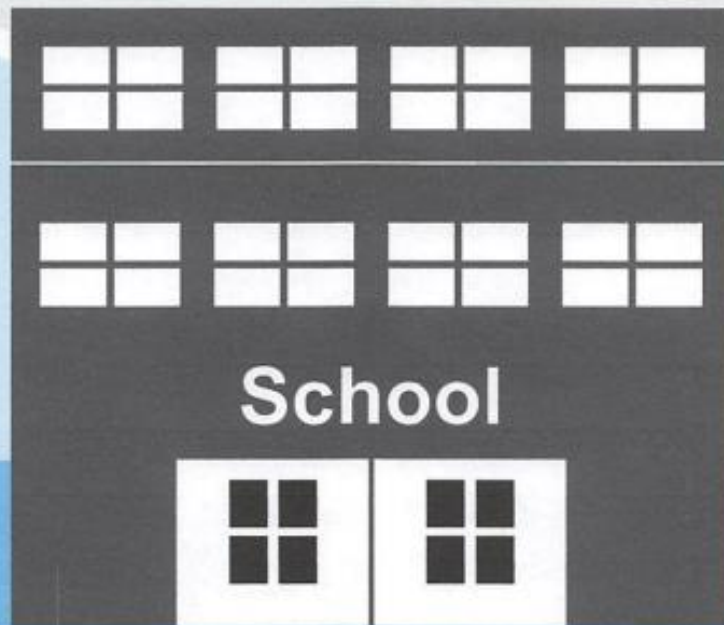

DISCIPLINE MATRIX – VAPING CONSEQUENCES

Student Code of Conduct Discipline:

1st Offense: 1-2 days in-school suspension (Administrative Detentions) with required intervention assignments and a referral to the District Substance Abuse Case Manager.

2nd Offense: 6-day suspension with required intervention program assignments and a referral to the District Substance Abuse Case Manager.

3rd and Subsequent Offenses: 10-day suspension, recommendation for expulsion and a referral to the District Substance Abuse Case Manager.

USE/POSSESSION OF UNAUTHORIZED SUBSTANCES IS PROHIBITED

SBBC Policy:

SECONDARY STUDENTS, (GRADES 6-12): THE STUDENT SHALL BE SUSPENDED FROM THE REGULAR SCHOOL PROGRAM FOR TEN (10) DAYS AND EXPULSION SHALL BE MANDATORY. THE STUDENT SHALL BE PLACED IN THE EXPULSION ABEYANCE PROGRAM FOR A PERIOD OF ONE (1) CALENDAR YEAR COMMENCING WITH THE DATE OF THE OFFENSE, WITH SUBSTANCE WORKBACK. THE EXPULSION SHALL BE HELD IN ABEYANCE IF THE STUDENT COMPLETES THE DISTRICT APPROVED OR STATE-CERTIFIED DRUG REHABILITATION OR TREATMENT PROGRAM WITH A CERTIFIED ADDICTION PROFESSIONAL. THE DISTRICT SUBSTANCE ABUSE CASE MANAGER SHALL MONITOR/ VERIFY THAT THE STUDENT HAS COMPLETED THE PROGRAM. THE STUDENT MAY RETURN TO A REGULAR SCHOOL PROGRAM UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE PRESCRIBED REHABILITATION OR TREATMENT PROGRAM.

EMERGENCY DRILLS










- Know the drill protocols for your classrooms and identify the safer space location(s) in each of your classrooms.
- Exit location/route for fire drills with end destination (where to find your teacher for attendance purposes). Take your bags with you when leaving the building – unless teacher states otherwise.
- Windows on classroom doors are to be covered in the event of a Code Red/drill.

DECODING THE CODES

IMPORTANT NOTICE -
IF ANY OF THE EMERGENCY CODES SHOULD OCCUR BEFORE SCHOOL OR DURING A CLASS CHANGE, STUDENTS ARE INSTRUCTED TO MOVE TO THE NEAREST CLASSROOM OR CAMPUS MAIN ENTRANCE, IF ALL DOORS ARE LOCKED. STUDENTS SHOULD FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS OF THE STAFF.

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SBBC DISTRICT EMERGENCY CODES

	RED: NO MOVEMENT IMMEDIATE DANGER Threat/Incident to the facility when best course of action is to keep everyone in place to include the School SAFE Team exceptions. The following are examples of incidents that could occur but are not limited to: Gun-to-Hostage (Active Hostage), Active Cyber, Possible terrorist on campus, Terrorist Threat, (3 Rings) Alternate to P.A.
	YELLOW: LIMITED MOVEMENT Threat/Incident to the facility when best course of action is to keep everyone in place but requires the School SAFE Team activation. The following are examples of incidents that could occur but are not limited to: Neighborhood Incident, Home Invasion, Bank Robbery in progress, Police Checkpoint (3 Rings) Alternate to P.A.
	BROWN: Shelter-in-Place or Evacuate Facility Threat/Incident to the facility when best course of action is to implement a shelter-in-place, "chemical incident outside of the facility" or that of an evacuation "chemical incident inside of the facility" or isolated or propane gas leak. Procedures depends on the nature of the school emergency. Examples: Chemical, Toxic Release, Explosion
	BLUE: MEDICAL EMERGENCY During a Code Red, Call 911. During a Code Yellow notify an Administrator or SAFE Team member of the medical emergency.
	BLACK: Bomb Threat EVACUATE FACILITY SAFE Team and staff members search the school building for suspicious items. Upon verifying the threat is legitimate by the Incident Command Staff (ICS) or their designees will commence and calls are made over the PA system, use of Mega Phone, or Bell System. (3 Rings) Alternate to P.A.
	GREEN: ALL CLEAR A password has been generated to ensure the legitimacy of the Incident Command Staff (ICS) or their designees giving the all clear code. However, a code yellow does not need to be used prior to the ICS or designees calling the all clear when in a Code Red.
	ORANGE: EVACUATE WHEN A SITUATION WARRANTS BEYOND PREVIOUS CODES This code is rarely used in chemical situations. Under a code brown to evacuate staff and students from the facility. Example: School is under a code brown. Fire Department arrives and determines school needs to be evacuated. Code Orange will be called with direction of where to evacuate to.

- Noise identifies students hiding. It is essential to be quiet during drills.
- If you are caught in a hallway or open area during a code yellow, find the closest classroom to seek shelter.
- If during a code red drill, you must find the closest bathroom or hiding place for shelter. (No doors will be opened for persons in hallways.)
